Lockdown across the Country : Stay Home ,Stay Safe



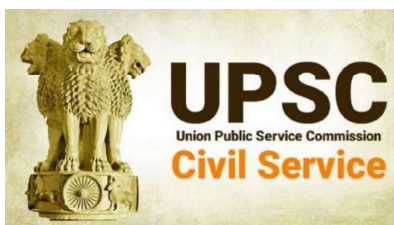

So who are these IAS officers and why are they important to us ?

IAS stands for Indian Administrative Services. The IAS officers are the levers of bureaucracy who actually turn the machinery of Governments working. They are the ones who actually take day-to-day decisions in lieu of Government.

So how do you actually become an IAS officer ? You have to clear the IAS exams and the interviews. Though popularly known as 'IAS exam', the official name of the exam is UPSC Civil Services Exam. It opens doors to various civil services such as IAS, IES, IFS etc

UPSC Civil Services exam is conducted in 3 phases: 1) Prelims and 2) Mains 3) Interview. The exam window extends over a year. The details of the exam papers ,eligibility can be obtained easily from the UPSC website or any related websites.

Candidate's join Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration (LBSNAA) as they successfully qualify the UPSC Civil Services Exam and becomes an IAS.

TN Seshan was one of the IAS toppers in 1955, the man who cleaned up India's elections. He implemented a variety of reforms in India's electoral process as the Chief Election Commissioner, which earned him the ire of many politicians but also endeavored him to the people of this country.

E Sreedharan, India's ' Metro Man, ' is another civil servant who brought about a major transformation in the country. The timely execution of the Delhi Metro project was carried out by Sreedharan, a Padma Vibhushan award winner. He was known for boldly side-lining political pressure and bypassing political interventions for speedy project execution.
